Dinho Nogueira and Zé Barbeiro: 6 and 7 strings guitars

Dinho Nogueira: guitarist, composer, arranger and professor, is coming from a family of musicians in which he was playing as drummer and singer since the age of six. In 2015 he recorded his first album as composer with the production and participation of Heraldo do Monte, in 2017 he recorded, already in partnership with Zé Barbeiro, the album "Enaltecendo o Choro" and in 2018, during a European tour he recorded in duo with Zé Barbeiro "Dinho Nogueira e Zé Barbeiro — ao vivo em Paris". He already played on stage with Hamilton de Holanda, Yamandú Costa, Alessandro Penezzi, Heraldo do Monte and various others major names of Brazilian music. As a professor he is teaching at Alpha University in Tatuí, at Colégio de Música of Jundiaí, where he is pedagogical supervisor and at Guri Santa Marcelina. In January of 2019 Dinho gave the first audition of his composition, Suíte "Um a Zero" which he wrote and arranged for two guitars and symphony orchestra.

Zé Barbeiro: guitarist and composer, he is representative of both the traditional and modern choro, since he plays in the rodas as well as in the recordings and on major stages along with artists like Altamiro Carrilho, Armandinho, Yamandú Costa, Hamilton de Holanda, Zeca Pagodinho, Fabiana Cozza, and many others. As composer he is cumulating more than two hundreds compositions. He won the Price Pixinguinha of 2008 when he recorded live at Itaú Cultural the album No Salão do Barbeiro. He was considered for the recording and touring in the state of São Paulo with the album "Sem Massagem", album which shows the potential modernity of the composer. In 2018, during a tour around Europe, he recorded in duo with Dinho Nogueira "Dinho Nogueira e Zé Barbeiro – ao vivo em Paris ".

Maria Inês Guimarães: pianist, composer, musicologist, pedagogue

Maria Inês has recorded 12 records as an interpreter, composer and musicologist. She founded with friends the group promoting music Jorrarte in 1980 in Uberaba. From 1987 to 1988, as Regional Head of the Brazilian Music Center in the city of Campinas, she carried out an important work of research and promotion of classical and popular Latin-American music. Maria Inês continues this work in France through the activities of the Euro-Brazilian Center of Music (Cebramusik) which she founded in 1996 and the presidency of the Choro Club of Paris since 2006. She has been an active member of the Choro Club since 2001 and imagined and created the Festival International de Choro de Paris, realized with the precious help of amateur and professional volunteers of Choro. She is a professor of piano and free improvisation at the Antony Conservatory, Greater Paris.

Olivier Lob: guitarist

Born in Germany, very early he discovered Jazz. At age 23 he studied jazz guitar and pedagogy of teaching of music at the prestigious Conservatory of Amsterdam (Netherlands). During his stay as a recipient of the University of Miami Scholarship (Florida, U.S.A.), he ignites for the Brazilian Popular Music. He moved to Toulouse, the cultural capital of the south, in 2003. Guitarist and cavaquinhist, Olivier is a specialist of Brazilian music that he plays on stage and that he transmits during internships and masterclasses in Europe as well as in Brazil and Japan. Under his direction in 2006, starts a project that offers the possibility of sharing and collaboration between musicians, professionals and amateurs: Casa de Choro de Toulouse. He regularly performs on stage with among others the groups Receita de Choro, Gosto Delicado, Trio Forró no Choro, ...

He is also initiator of many projects to familiarize the French with the Brazilian culture authentic, far from clichés of rhinestones and glitter.

Ricardo Junta Perez: percussionist

Interpreter and pedagogue, born in Ribeirão Preto / SP, he earned the diploma of percussion performer at the Arte and Sound Conservatory of Ribeirão Preto and a bachelor's degree at Cl

He is a founding member of the Regional Ginga Group Ligeira, who develops an author work in instrumental music.

Lucas de Oliveira Lopes: Coming from MPB / JAZZ training at the Tatuí Conservatory and in phonographic production by FATEC, he is multi-instrumentalist (electric guitar, strings, cavaco, contrabass), arranger, composer and lyricist. He worked with characters devoted to Brazilian instrumental music such as Cleber 'Carrapicho' Rangel, Fabio Leal, Paulo Almeida among others. Since 2013 he has been developing a songs project 'Duos' where, in partnership with other artists, he incorporates other arrangements to dedicated songs just as his own pieces. Henrique Neto is one of the most important guitarists in the Brazilian music scene. His elegant and creative style is defined by his strong references to the Choro but also by his openness to jazz and classical music. His work has already been hailed by iconic musicians such as Guinga, Yamandú Costa, Dominguinhos, Hamilton de Holanda and others. He is Assistant Director and Professor at the Brazilian School of Choro Raphael Rabello in Brasilia, author of the book Manuel du Choro (2017) and founder of the school of Choro Online.

The trumpet player Gileno Santana, a name that resonates on the international music scene, returns to his origins, the sound of tradition. Recognized by musicians like, Wynton Marsalis, Cláudio Roditi, James Morrison, Thomas Gansch, Gábor Tarkövi, he created a unique musical landscape where intense or subtle notes meet in a lyricism of a rare beauty.
